We are so grateful for the prayer partners that the Lord has given us in ministry. We can't fathom what it would be like without that oh-so-important recourse of being placed daily in our Savior's faithful care. Oh, how we covet your prayers that we stay in that covert under His wings mentioned in the verses above. Thank you for your faithfulness in praying for us and giving for the Lord's work. It takes teamwork. Without our team we couldn't keep going.

We were able to go to Puerto Rico for the graduation of four of our students. Please pray with us that the Lord will provide a new president for the college. Technically, Bacilio resigned as president, but since we have not gotten a president, by default, Bacilio legally continues to function as the president.

We have been to many places in our own country in Hispanic ministries. We had the privilege to participate in a family camp in the mountains of Utah. We have been to Florida, Texas, Tennessee, North and South Carolina, and Illinois, usually with only time enough at home to wash clothes and pack again for another engagement. We need large supplies of strength and rest from the Lord, but He has certainly blessed us. In April we were so humbled to be feted in Lakeland, Florida, to celebrate our 50th wedding anniversary, as they couldn't do it in 2020. Wow, three churches participated. They celebrated with a "praise service" for the Lord's goodness, sent us off riding in a limousine (a 1927 Model-T-Ford, with the owner-driver who was born in 1937, and Bacilio who was born in 1947). They then had a sumptuous meal and gifts for us. One of the churches had raised money and bought rings for us. What a humbling experience for us as we know we are so unworthy, but we are so very grateful.

We just returned from Mexico where we had the privilege to minister in different areas for a month. We were in two weeks of camps in Michoacán, Mexico, for young people coming from many different parts of the country. The first week was training for the counselors and camp workers. We had never participated in that manner at a camp. It was a real blessing for us. The second week there were around 300 campers, drivers, and chaperones. The Lord greatly blessed with 16 souls that were saved, as well as 16 young people that surrendered to serve the Lord full-time. There were also many other decisions made during that time. It was a real blessing to have some young people come talk to us to let us know of progress made in their lives after the decisions they made in the different classes we had the privilege to give last year at camp. That is what it is all about. God is so good to give the increase.

From Michoacan we went to Celaya, Guanajuato, Mexico, to participate in a national meeting of Fuegos de Evangelismo (Fires of Evangelism). There were probably between 3,000 to 4,000 attendees from many parts of Mexico, as well as from some of the Central American countries. They kept us busy going from place to place on the grounds to teach different groups. There were many decisions made. Please pray

with us that the Lord will seal each decision for His honor and glory. From Celaya we went on to Cuernavaca, Morelos, for several days. We got home on Monday, August 8, but our luggage didn't follow us. For two days we were internet chasing our luggage. We finally received it on Wednesday (the 10th), the day before we were to leave for Colorado. Thankfully, there was time to get our clothes washed before we had to leave again. We got back yesterday, Monday, but will be leaving again for San Francisco on Thursday. Please pray that the Lord will continue to use us and give us the strength and stamina needed to "keep on keeping on" for Him.

Please continue to pray for Bacilio's health. The last test period, his kidney function had improved slightly, although we must say that was before we began our globe-trotting again. Thank the Lord, he does not feel badly at all, although he does tire. Please keeps him in your prayers.
