## News from Bacilio and Eunice Alfaro

March – June 2020

Dear Co-laborers in God's Vineyard,

Thank you for the concern so many of you have expressed for us both personally and on behalf of the church. You folks are very special to us, and we have been praying for you.

As of March 2, our traveling preaching schedule came to a screeching halt due to the Covid-19 virus. We are both in good health. The Lord has protected us during this whole incident. One church that has no pastor asked Bacilio to preach each week twice on Sunday until they were able to begin services again in their church. That was a bilingual church in Garland, Texas, and thus the preaching had to be done bilingually. On a couple of Sundays, Bacilio preached twice each Sunday for two different churches, for a total of four services. Thankfully, he didn't have to travel between each service as one was in Texas and the other in the southern part of Mexico.

We have had the privilege of participating in conferences and for individual churches in different Hispanic countries, as well as here in the USA by social media, and continue to do so. We have been so blessed to be able to continue to be in ministry even if it is from our home office.

As of a few weeks ago, we began to slowly get back into the groove of reporting to our churches and preaching in other churches. Thus far we have been within a few hours of home. This past weekend we were preaching and teaching on Sunday for the anniversary of a Hispanic church in Charleston, South Carolina. We left that area on Tuesday. We then learned that the pastor and his family all have tested positive for Covid-19. Thankfully, most of them have not had severe cases, although the oldest son is having more problems, and they would appreciate your prayers. They are the Alvarez family. We are now in self-quarantine for two weeks but do not expect it to develop into anything.

During this time, many mission boards and churches worried that the tithes and offerings would drop off and, thus, jeopardize their monthly expenses and missions giving. I would not say it never crossed the minds of the missionaries. We have always trusted the Lord and lived on whatever He provided through the giving of our so faithful partners in ministry, our supporting churches. God has so graciously provided for us in ways that we could not have imagined. Our prayers are with and for the churches that are suffering because of lower tithes and offerings. We pray that their hearts will be encouraged in the Lord, as was David's during some of the low times in his life. (I Sam. 30:6b . . . *but David encouraged himself in the LORD his God.*)

Thank you, dear Church family, for your faithfulness to the Lord, and thus to us. You are a tremendous blessing and encouragement to us. We love you.
